

Greene County Conservation District 2025 Poster Contest Official Rules

- All posters must be created by an individual student, rather than a team of students. Entry must be contestant's original creation and may not be traced from photographs or other artists' published works.
 - Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, the District encourages each student to do their own work. Note: Entries with student handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn, and colored by adult assistance.
 - Students may complete posters as a part of a school project or as a personal project at home. Meaning that posters will be accepted from schools or individual parents.
- Any media may be used, including paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper or other materials.
 - The District does **not** accept posters incorporating three-dimensional elements.
 - There is no longer a poster size requirement.
- The 2025 Stewardship theme "Home is Where the Habitat Is" **MUST** be included on the front side of each poster submission.
- The Conservation District will be accepting either original or digital submissions in 2025. Originals may be delivered to the District office (address below) or teachers/parents/guardians may contact the District to arrange pick-up.
 - Digital submissions should be a photograph or scan of the original artwork in JPEG or PDF format. The poster should take up the full frame of the image.
 - Each poster submitted electronically should be named using the following format: Grade Level-Last Name, First Name
 - Each entry **MUST** be submitted with an entry form to be eligible for judging. The form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian.
- This contest is open to students in kindergarten through eighth grade. The Conservation District Board of Directors will judge posters in four divisions (K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-8).
 - The top three entrants in each division will receive a cash prize of either \$50, \$75 or \$100.
 - The first-place winner of each division will be sent to a statewide competition held by the Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts.
- Posters should be kept until winners are announced.
- Poster Contest entries are reviewed based on the following criteria:
 - Conservation message (50 percent) (Poster uses correct theme)
 - Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
 - Originality (10 percent)
 - Universal appeal (10 percent)
- **Entries must be received by April 9, 2025**
